

Marcus Kirk Receives Undergraduate Teaching Award

Dr. Marcus Kirk is one of five professors in the Warrington College of Business to receive a 2012-13 Teaching award. The awards are to encourage and reward excellence, innovation, and effectiveness in teaching and advising. Dr. Kirk was honored with one of three Undergraduate Teaching Awards and is the College's nominee for a university-wide teaching award.

Dr. Kirk has served at the Fisher School of Accounting since 2009 and is currently the Luciano Prida, Sr. Term Assistant Professor of Accounting. Dr. Kirk has written numerous articles and made frequent presentations examining how corporate managers use discretion in their financial reporting, particularly voluntary disclosure decisions, and the capital market consequences of these decisions. At the undergraduate level, Dr. Kirk teaches the course Financial Accounting and Reporting I. In addition to his teaching and research, Dr. Kirk has served on Fisher's Accounting Faculty Recruiting Committee, Doctoral Program Committee and as its Research Workshop Coordinator. Dr. Kirk earned a Bachelor of Commerce from the University of Victoria (Canada) and a Ph.D. in Accounting from Emory University in 2009.
